Students can gain valuable experience through day-to-day organisational activities, events, meetings and community engagement opportunities. Outback Prac placements typically run for 1-2 weeks during university semesters:

- **Semester 1:** March to May
- **Semester 2:** August to October

For reference, most students are from the ECU/WAAPA Bachelor of Arts (Arts and Cultural Management) program. While Semester 1 students are generally focused on Applied Arts Law and Venue Operations, and Semester 2 students typically have a Finance focus, all students gain exposure to and contribute across a broad range of organisational activities during their placement. The program may also support tertiary students from other institutions such as Curtin University, SAE College and UWA, and cover longer placement periods.
